It looks likely that the box office for Brighton Fringe 2024, will be situated in Circus Street in a vacant unit. The area has limited parking, is accessible and has refreshment options nearby. 8. Duncan Lustig Prean (Chair of the Board Updates)

Flyering licenses will be available from the Artist's Hub at the Ledward Centre. For more details about where flyering licenses are required please see our <u>website</u>.

Students from Brighton University are undertaking a business consultation during Fringe, covering a number of areas including understanding the demographics of our audience and why we attract so few under 25s.

Fringe have now held two very successful showcases and intend to continue these after Fringe to help rase awareness of the work we do year round. They are also an excellent opportunity to provide paid performance slots to our artists, giving them a chance to perform to new audiences and in a variety of venues.

Discussions about the future of the Fringe staff team are ongoing as we look at the advantages and disadvantages of working without a CEO. This past six months without a CEO has seen the staff work more collaboratively and with a shared creative energy. An alternative option could be to recruit an Artistic Director/ Festival Director, Financial Director and someone with good fundraising experience. Each of these roles could be part time.

9. Venue Manager Updates

Rotunda – more companies involved than last year, but only slightly as a couple have pulled out. 69 companies delivering a similar number of actual performances to last year. Ticket sales are currently up 25% on last year.

Rotunda printed brochure is available now, covering shows taking place at both Brighton and Tunbridge Wells Fringe.

The Brunswick – approximately 20 companies and 35 shows mixed in with non-Fringe shows taking place during the same time period. This is an increase on last year. Quietly confident on ticket sales, and just closing on the most successful quarter ever!

Have a leaning towards love music, but also host some comedy, family events etc.

Purple Playhouse – No Fringe shows booked for this year but hoping to return as a venue either this year or next. Have a second floor theatre as well as a ground floor venue space. Considering predominantly comedy showcases at this stage.

Laughing Horse – All good to go. Same number of shows as last year but a little bit up on ticket sales. A few mid-week spots still available that can be marketed to artists.

SE Dance – First year as a venue and hosting 4 Fringe events alongside their own Dance programme and some Festival shows. Looking forward to hosting more events outside the dance genre. During Fringe, studio rehearsal space is available for artists for just £12 ph.

10. AOB

The next VMM will be held at the <u>Caroline of Brunswick</u> on **April 23**rd at **2pm.** This will be the last meeting before Fringe.
